Outstanding Civil Service Medal

The infantry platoon was plodding along, led by their Second Lieutenant in command. The muddy road turned the advance into a slogging, slipping task of keeping one's balance rather than the brisk march the men were accustomed to making. As the lieutenant rounded a bend he sighed and moved his mount off to the side. A large tree had fallen across the path during the previous night's storm.

"All right men! Put your shoulders to the log and move it." He watched complacently as their efforts proved futile. The log moved some, but kept rocking back in place. They needed just a little more muscle to get it to roll away.

Just then another man rode up closer after having watched the situation develop from the edge of the woods. He rode a beautiful white stallion from which he calmly dismounted, threw his cape over the saddle and proceeded to put his shoulder to the log. That last added effort got it rolling out of the way to the applause of the lieutenant.

As he looked at the gentleman a growing sense of recognition was battling its way from his subconscious mind, struggling to be acknowledged. The way the man walked lent an air of command to his person. The lieutenant has seen that walk before. The man's short legs were well compensated for by his tall trunk towering over the platoons tired soldiers.

Just as the man mounted, the lieutenant was about to thank him. But the words from the man stunned him to silence.

"The next time you need any help moving logs with your troops, just call on your Commander In Chief!" With that, General George Washington rode off into history.

Perhaps because of that true story as it was told to me, as well as many other examples of selfless service to others, a tradition has continued with those who provide service to the President of the United States. Currently, that service is provided by "The Eleventh Wing" of the Air Force.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the Commanding General, a four star, graciously invited Wonders of Science to speak. The assembled military commanders of dozens of the world's armies were there for a briefing on national security issues. The General wanted WOS to brief these officers on the spiritual nature of the men and women they were responsible for in their various commands.



The Lord moved in a tremendous way over the crowds keeping their attention and creating receptive hearts. Following the presentation, WOS was presented with a distinguished service medal. I accepted it on behalf of Dr.

Irwin Moon (founder of the science demonstrations) and Dr. George Speake (Navy fighter pilot and my immediate predecessor).

The next words whispered to me by the General stunned me to silence! He leaned over as he shook my hand and said, "You don't yet realize the significance of that medal, but

there is a number stamped under the symbol." I turned it over and saw the number "032" on the back (see photo). He continued, "There have only been thirty-one people since the days of General Washington to have received that medal and you are the thirty-second! Congratulations."

This was another of those times I wished that the thousands of our WOS supporters could have been standing there with me on that platform. Here I was, in front of some of the world's most powerful men, receiving an award on behalf of so many of the Lord's faithful. I thank all of you for the singular privilege of representing your service to Him through Wonders of Science these past decades.
