

Prayer began decades ago! One of my colleagues at Moody Institute of Science was orphaned as a child and taken in by the Milton Hershey School for Boys, now Milton Hershey Boarding School in Hershey, PA. Bob and Dolly are treasured friends and were professional colleagues during our three decades of ministry through MIS. All those years they kept praying for an opening at the school so those displaced children could also hear the gospel.

After presentations students usually have many questions.

One of the leaders responsible for a half dozen young people had been an orphan there and was raised his entire life at the school. He ultimately became a house parent able to effectively relate to those in his care. It was his team that helped us unload and set up for the program.

I'd visited the school years ago as a "tourist" while I was presenting the science programs at the Hershey Theme Park (similar to a Disneyland experience) for the Word of Life organization. There was little interest expressed at that time, but after a recent change in administration and a new school chaplain, the Lord opened the door.

Our allotted time was a Sunday morning chapel service. The full auditorium was not expecting what they experienced during that "sermon" for sure. What a warm reception by students and staff alike. Many questions afterwards kept us busy long after students

normally left for the day's activities.
