Many of those who spent time in the booth were filled with questions and timely concerns. Terry was able to help each one become more aware of how much the Lord is able to accomplish in lives as we yield to His plans.

The Homeschool crowd was very anxious to participate in the hands-on program.

One exciting blessing for Terry and me during our summer tour was the able assistance of Ted Chapanian, a young man I'd met recently after a science series presented at BIOLA University in La Mirada, CA. I'd been asked to present the programs to the annual ACSI Science Fair, a gathering of very enthusiastic youths who were representing their various schools after winning their local science fairs.

Ted and his friends helped load and unload the gear. However, Ted hung around after

Y es, we actually did! The Navajo Nation's capitol is in Window Rock, AZ, but the nation actually encompasses land that involves four different states, AZ, NM, UT, and CO. Window Rock is about 1½ miles into AZ from the NM border, northwest of Gallup, NM. The area is known for the unusual rock formation seen in the accompanying photo.

The families who helped us during the home school convention in Phoenix also drove up to Window Rock to assist us there. On one occasion we visited the rock formations just outside of town. We had a wonderful time collecting fossil seashells as we climbed the local mountains reaching some 7,000 feet! I wonder if Noah realized the controversy he'd be causing by not burying such things out of reach for today's compromising church? Some of the fossils were so delicate that they broke apart with the slightest touch, evidence that they'd been buried in place and not thrust up from the depths.

One of the many highlights of our ministry there was to meet two recent members of the Navajo Nation's Supreme Court. What was really exciting was to learn

that one of the ladies was a strong Bible believing Christian who had devoted her life to helping her people to come to know the true Great Spirit, the Creator, the Lord Jesus Christ. Louise speaks her mind regarding the things of the Lord as was apparent in the local newspaper's positive articles about her.

We were there at the Window Rock National Navajo Museum just outside of the rock formations as the Nation's Council had just broken up for lunch. Louise and her associate were visiting the museum, wearing their formal native dress. We just had to ask about their attire and had a wonderful conversation only to learn of their recent high calling as justices. Louise honored us with her presence at our last demonstration, the "Million Volts".

One unusual thing we learned during our stay was brought to light because of our housing location. The local

river had flooded and caused a very steep climb to and from our host's guest house. On either side of the road leading up from the gorge were two funeral homes. In the winter, they are unable to drive the hearse down the embankment due to the icy conditions. The only other route is longer and winds through the reservation at times.

From this we learned that the traditional Navajo belief is that whenever a dead person passes by, the medicine man must be called to cleanse the land again. This becomes very expensive, so one can see the reluctance that particular native groups would have to seeing that hearse making yet another pass through their lands.


We also learned that if one mentioned death and directed that to a particular individual, you were actually putting a curse upon that person and wishing them to also die. We had to change how we talked of that subject from the stage. The words that the inviting pastor suggested we use were "passing on, going to one's reward" or even, "gathered to his people."

Continue to pray for the pastor and his family as they faithfully minister to their congregation and the local Christian school, founded as a mission way back in the mid-1800's.
