Science Moment

Job, have you considered the treasures in the snow? God asked Job if he could create rain, dew, ice, or frost (Job 38: 28, 29). Water is truly an amazing substance. A liquid raindrop when frozen is ice, gaseous water vapor when it sublimates is frost, and like dry ice, it can go back to a gas without passing through the liquid state. Water can float as a gas, flow as a liquid and freeze as a solid, which curiously, floats on water.

Most of earth's fresh water above ground is frozen and 90% of that almost completely covers the continent of Antarctica. If you cut Antartica's ice sheet into cubic mile ice cubes you would have more than 6 million of them. If all that ice melted, the earth's oceans would rise 260 feet! But that won't happen! "God has set a boundary for the seas that they may not pass over and return to cover the earth." (Ps. 104:9) "Even the wind and the seas obey Him!" (Mark 4:41)
